Press Conference – January 3, 2021
San Francisco 49ers vs. Seattle Seahawks**

Opening comments:

"Injuries from the game: [DL] Dion Jordan had a knee and did not return. Don't think it'll be too serious. Go ahead"

How would you describe your emotions just in terms of maybe frustration or loss relief that the season's over, or are you full steam ahead into 2021 already?

"No, I'm very happy to seasons over. We we've been, you know, once we eliminated from the playoffs, we were ready to move on a little bit and get to next year. But we had to finish it and it was really proud of the guys today. I thought those guys competed their off in all aspects. I told them to hold their heads high. I didn't think, it wasn't a moral victory or anything because I believe we should have won the game. There was a couple of plays that we just needed to make at the end that we didn't and they did. And they were able to pull that off. So that was disappointing, but I'm so proud of our guys. They gave all they could in every opportunity that they had. I'm excited this year is over. And now it's time to figure out how to improve us."

You alluded to it. But how excited are you about getting back to the Bay Area, I guess in a few hours?

"Very excited. First time I've ever packed two days in advance for anything. We're all excited to see our families and everything. We got a little break. Some of us saw our families over Christmas, which is nice. Some weren't able to so it's been way too long for a number of guys. And just, being stuck in a hotel for I think over 30 days. I mean, that does wear on you a little bit. Not just me, but the players, the cooks, the equipment guys. Everybody involved with us is ready to get back home."

Given the parameters in Santa Clara County, how will you handle things like exit interviews and physicals and things like that, that typically end a season?

"Yeah, I mean, we're going to have to be smart with everything, but I look at it, the way we kind of did business since we've been there. I mean the way we've done all our business with all our zoom meetings with everyone spaced out. We had that as good as set up as, I would say, almost anyone in the country. The main thing is we can't go out and practice football anymore and we don't have to worry about that right now."

You've seen that from Russell Wilson a few times, but you know, when you have the 10-point lead, I am sure you're not comfortable with him. Was that just kind of a vintage fourth-quarter performance by him?

"Yeah, that's why they win a lot of games. They try to hang in there until the fourth and thought we had enough of a lead to do it. And I thought there was a couple plays that we missed that we would've had a much better chance to kind of put the dagger in them a little bit, which is always hard with Russell. But, the plays he made at the end, just extending those plays, thought we had a couple of chances to get him in the pocket. And when he's squeezes through there, I mean, that's why he's one of the best to play this. And, that's why he's one of the better guys in the league. And, that's why they ended up pulling it out there at the end."

RB Jeff Wilson Jr. scored another two touchdowns today. I'm guessing he's one of the bigger, bright spots of the season. And just how hard did he finish it off today?

"Honestly, I feel like Jeff's done the same thing every time we've asked them to. Even last year. We didn't ask them as much last year, because there a few guys ahead of them who were playing at a very high level. And at that we were a little more fortunate with injuries last year at the running back position."

But this year losing all of our guys pretty early that played last year, got him some opportunities fast. Then unfortunately he got hurt too. And then he was able to come back to the end and finish strong. And I think the main thing with Jeff is, like a lot of guys on our team, him doing his part throughout this whole off season and us doing our part to figure out how we can help him and anyone in any way. We've got a lot of good players, but we've got to find out how to handle the wear and tear of an entire season."

This is probably the last game for defensive coordinator Robert Saleh. How much was that discussed or talked about with the players and was it any sort of motivating factor do you think for the defense's energy throughout the game?

"I know how much the players respect Robert as a coach and love him as a person. So, I wouldn't say that today was any extra. I feel like that's why they fight for him every week. I mean, when you've got coaching staff who knows what they're doing and also is connected and invested in the players, all guys want to do is be coached the right way and they want you to care about them. And Saleh does that as good as anyone. I was very happy with what he did throughout the whole year. I will be very surprised just like you said, if we don't lose them. I don't know what's wrong with people if they don't hire him. I mean, he's as good as you can get and knows more about football, all three phases. And he's going to hire the best staff. He knows about players. He knows who knows what they're talking about. Who doesn't know what they're talking about. And he also knows how to deal with people. So, I hope everyone's not very smart and doesn't hire them so I can keep him. But, I'm expecting not to have them. But, we've got a lot of other good guys on our staff and I know there'll be a number of options and we've got a number of good players. And what we built here over the four years with Saleh, with the whole coaching staff, and we haven't made many changes. So, there's a lot of guys who we've all grown here together. And we've got a lot of players who are used to it too. So, I expect whatever we ended up deciding here. And obviously we'll wait to see what happens with Saleh. But, I know that the Niners will be all right."

There was a report today that Robert would interview with the Falcons this week. Can you share at this point, whether you've been asked permission by teams to talk to him about their vacancies?

"I don't think that we have. I'm sure that'll happen all tomorrow. I mean, I don't think, and no, that never happened with me until the Monday of. A lot of people try to do it out of respect to you. And I know Saleh is going to have a number lined up and I think he is going to get one with Atlanta pretty fast. I know it's a little weird situation with these guys interviewing out of zoom and not kind of the normal way that you do it. So, I am pretty sure that he's got one with Atlanta tomorrow and I know others will start coming later in the week."

Statistically, I think that was LB Azeez Al-Shaair's best game in a 49ers uniform. Were you happy with the way that he seized the opportunity this year after New Orleans Saints LB Kwon Alexander left to New Orleans with more playing time?

"Yes. I mean him and [LB] Dre [Greenlaw]. Dre got that last year but then Azeez to come in and base and take that role. And then today, when we lost Greenlaw, being able to stay out there every down. Azeez has done a lot of good stuff for us here in these two years. And it will be a big off season for him though. I liked a lot of the stuff we saw today. But, I want him to keep getting better. Keep trying to own that role to get it become a starter full-time and also being better and helping us out more on special teams."

You said you can't wait to figure out how to improve us. And obviously you're going to answer a hundred million quarterback questions this off season, but I want to know where do you think you guys can improve defensively just based on how your unit performed this year?

"I think we can improve everywhere. I mean, we've got to get some guys healthy back, which when you lose some big time pass rushers, that changes a lot of stuff. So, I think one of the biggest things is figuring out, getting our guys healthy. Getting them the right program, which I know most of them already started. And then when you have a good nucleus of players and you've got a good scheme, you don't sit there and necessarily always just target, 'Hey, this, whatever this stats said, we have to improve in this.' I mean, you do that as you watch tape and everything, but you look at all the options. You look in the draft hard, you look at for a free agency hard. And you see who has a chance to make your team who can improve your team. And you just go at it as hard as you can."

You spoke about how the players have not given up at all in this season, but did you sense as like a little bit of sense of relief now that you're finally able to go home, that it's finally over? And then what's the next step for you and the team?

"There's no doubt there's relief. That's been adding up. So that was my worry, just from human nature, when you start to get concerned about how miserable you are in a certain area and you want to get home and things like that. Letting your circumstances affect your job and things like that. And that's why I was proud that our guys didn't do that, but there's no doubt they're ready to get back. And just for us going forward, we'll work this week. I want to figure out a number of things with the coaches, which I don't think will happen right away unless we get to play that out, see if anything does happen to Saleh or any other coaches on our staff who could get some opportunities. And then usually after that, try to get away for a little bit. Just out of the building, away from some of these guys that we've been around every day. I know they would probably like to not see me for a little bit. But then out of the office, you've got to figure out a bunch of stuff. I mean, you get to be with your family, but you've got to be on your own little schedule. So, whenever I'm not with the family, usually for entertainment, as sad as it is, I'm probably watching some film. And now, sometimes it's going to be college players. Sometimes it's gonna be free agents. Sometimes it's going to be our guys. Also, we'll see if there's an opportunity to talk to other coaches if things open up and maybe guys to interview and stuff to see if they can upgrade our staff or whatever it might be. And that's kind of usually how you spend January getting all your ducks in order in that way and try to get everyone back right after the Super Bowl. And that's when you just start hitting it hard with everyone working together and getting ready for combine whatever will happen with that."

Through all the adversity you faced this season, what did you learn about yourself? And then, what did you learn about your teammates?

"I mean, I would just say first off, you know, you can battle through anything that's thrown at you in life. Whenever there are certain things that hit you, that you feel like you can't recover from or you feel like you'll never recover from, yeah you can. And I would just tell that to anybody out there who feels down in the dumps or something, if something happened in their life where they feel like they can't overcome it, you always can. With my teammates, I just appreciate the way they battled all year and I'm real proud of them. You know, we were put in a tough situation going to, here in Arizona for the last six or so weeks. Just the way they've handled it and came to work each day, I'm real proud of them for that."

I'm sure you guys would have loved to have started faster on offense. Obviously, that pass to WR Richie James seemed to spark you a little bit, but was there something that clicked as far as figuring out their defense or was it just kind of waking up?

"I mean, it was a little bit of both. The first couple of drives, they were calling the perfect, really the perfect coverage for the certain plays that we had on or whatnot. And credit to them, they were doing a good job. And then part of it just us not executing also. So yeah, a little bit of both."

I realize it may be too soon to ask this, but a year from now, when you look back on the Arizona, the Glendale experience, how do you think you'll remember it? What do you think will kind of stick in your mind for the coming years about that?

"Hopefully we don't ever have to do this again first off. But, there were some good times, some good memories here with the guys when you're all kind of bunked up in the same hotel you get to see them in passing a little bit. We weren't allowed to really hang out or whatever. So that kind of stunk, but overall, you learn from it and you get better from the situation you're put in."

San Francisco 49ers vs. Seattle Seahawks**

Opening comments:

"Really, really thankful for this football season for our team to get all the way to 12 and all that, to finish really with four straight wins which is something that doesn't happen very often, and we're real proud of just the way we finished. To get it done, it was hard. So this was a difficult day for us. We didn't play the way we wanted to on offense early on. Defense played great for a long time and then we let them get out on a couple big plays and they did some nice stuff. Their best player came through and made some great plays for them. But all in all when it came down to it, we had to win in the fourth quarter and our guys did and that's what it took to finish this 2020 in the regular season, it's what it took to finish this four-game stretch that we were pointing to. We wanted to win four games and know what that's like moving forward. And we wanted to always see our guys come through and outlast the other guys and find a way to win a football game, even if it goes down to the last second. We did a lot of cool things there. I think it was a really fantastic day for our receiving crew for [Seattle Seahawks WR] Tyler Lockett to have his numbers, and he didn't even come close. He had to get seven for a record and he got 12 catches today. Had a fantastic day. Two great touchdown passes for us and just beautiful catches and just a beautiful season he had all throughout, and everybody should -- it's almost quietly, because he's just so consistently good, but he had a fantastic year and he's had a great year, and really proud for that. Also [Seattle Seahawks WR] DK [Metcalf] set a record today, too. That was the 100 catches that Tyler and then DK set a record for yards and whenever you're messing around with Steve Largent and a great one like that and you can eclipse some numbers, it's a fantastic accomplishment in his second year as a receiver. Really exciting. Two 1,000-yard guys in that room, too. Fantastic. Great seasons and they deserve all the credit for that. The reason we won today, we didn't turn the ball over, again, that's how you do it. We're 12-0 this year when we're plus or even and that's a fantastic statement about taking care of the football and to get through another game and not give it up makes all the difference in winning and losing. So we wound up plus one for the day, great sack, caused a fumble. That is such an important part of our football game and always has been and always will be and look at the games we didn't win, crazy. Really fired that up we continue to be a finishing club and that we're finding ways to do it. We can match-up our numbers at the end of the season with anybody. It's something that's in the blood around here and I'm really proud of that. Finishing strong is always something that we love and here we go, here comes playoff time. The start to this finish begins this next weekend."

Sorry to go here so quickly but I think Seattle Seahawks SS Jamal Adams on the sideline looked pretty dejected. What injury update can you give us on his status? What did he hurt and how serious does it look?

"He hurt his shoulder and he was just so disappointed, more dejected about the fact he got banged up, I think it was on a pass rush and we'll see what happens. We'll see what that means for next week. I can't tell you. The early stuff from the trainers is that he'll play next week but we'll have to see how he does get through the week."

Seattle Seahawks DT Jarran Reed, what's his situation?

"He had an oblique strain that happened in early, middle of the game, and he went back in with it and played with it, pretty sore coming out, though. So have to see what that means. I don't have any forecast there."

And Seattle Seahawks RB Rashaad Penny?

"He cramped up. So he's fine."

With Jamal, is that the same shoulder that he injured earlier?

"No. It's the other one. Other shoulder."

What do you make of the day that Seattle Seahawks QB Russell Wilson had?

"Great finish. We didn't get going. We couldn't get going early on. Such a slow start for us. But as he did last week, again, he had a great fourth quarter. Led the touchdown drives, throwing and running. Great plays. Great resolve through the whole thing to get it done. It's what you count on from him because he's the real deal and he can do it and he did it again."

You mentioned the slow start for the offense. What were you season from that side of the ball when they were scuffling to find it and what flipped the last couple drives?

"We couldn't start converting and we ran the ball better in the second half. We didn't run the ball very well early on. I don't know what our numbers were but just getting the mix, it's a really good defense, again, I know they are banged up but still they have been playing everybody tough. They have been hard. The defenses in this division are legit, including ours. It's a challenge every week. This is how it is."

You mentioned going into the game with cramps and Seattle Seahawks RB Chris Carson had to come out for a little while, too. How important was it late in the game trying to come back that you got some of those pivotal carries from Seattle Seahawks RB Alex Collins being called up from the practice squad?

"Yeah, thanks for bringing it up. What a great finish he had. That touchdown run was sweet. He knocked out some yards when we needed it in great fashion. Whenever Alex gets his chance he does stuff and he's a good football player and we're really lucky to have him. It was a great finish for him."

First three quarters, Russell's deep ball accuracy wasn't there.

"He threw a couple balls away and a couple scramble situations where we kind of weren't going the same way on the same page, which happens sometimes. You know, they are all different plays. They weren't like just throwing go balls and we weren't hitting them. Everyone was a little bit different in its own way, and he had to hurry on a couple of them, and the one to Noehy (ph) down in the corner, we were really excited about that play. He just had to get that ball up and down because of the rush. So we just didn't hookup on it."

What started clicking offensively? You touched on it but second straight week where you guys go two-plus quarters, or this one two-plus quarters, last week it was the first half and then a switch flips and it starts clicking. Is it as simple as converting third downs?

"I don't know, the games looked to me like there's a patience to it that nobody wants to see but we are feeling okay about it. We just have to make sure we come out of it and we get the points we need to win. I thought the defense played really good today throughout, and we got in that two-minute mode there and we played it too -- we gave too much to them and let them get down the field. It kind of distorts what happened in the game by those guys, and we just need to keep playing often. It's a little frustrating. You guys, you're wondering about it but I'm not worried about it. We are going to keep

playing and try to play really good football, not give it to them and play championship ball and see how far that takes us.”

When you added Seattle Seahawks DE Carlos Dunlap III, you mentioned with Seattle Seahawks DE Benson Mayowa it may help him, a little fresher and help him with another rusher how much did you see that tonight?

“Yeah, it really has. It's enhanced the whole group. And we've gone three sacks, three sacks, three sacks, what it seems like the last month or something like that. That's real consistency and I think since the (7th) game, we've been the highest sack team in the NFL and you can see it. We've got four-man rush. It's exciting to see it continue to show up in the games. I do think it all fits together and Carlos is a force on the other side. He's right in the mug of the right hand of quarterbacks they can feel it.”

With Benson in particular, getting two sacks and the fumble, up to six sacks for him this year, what has he meant to you?

“Wish we just would have had him all year. He missed some time with us. He's a really savvy football player. He has good stuff good, moves and things and you just need to give him his turns. He's just been a real good, positive addition and we've been really lucky to have him.”

It seemed like you preserved RB Chris Carson a little bit and you took him out for caution and give RB Rashaad Penny a chance?

“Well, we wanted Penny to play more and we just wanted to get him going. Obviously, we did because he cramped up; he needs the work. But whether we had Carlos or whether, you know, we had Alex, we knew that we were okay there and so Chris had a couple things that happened during the game that just needed a break and all that. So we just looked after him through the game and we were happy to play Rashaad. We wanted to see him play. And then Alex wrapped it up.”

The blitz pick up on the go ahead touchdown by Carson, probably an overlooked aspect of his game?

“Yeah, I didn't see that, so I really can't comment. But I know Chris is a stud blocker. He steps in whenever he has to and I know everybody is fired up about the protection. I just didn't see it myself so I can't tell you. Yeah, you can count on Chris. He gives it up where he needs to and he's been very, very consistent.”

And then is this where the defense, where you wanted it to be going into the playoffs?

“I'm thrilled about the fact that we've just continued to crescendo. We have continued to play solid football and keep the points down. I'm ready to play anybody, doesn't matter who we play. And whatever it is, it is, and our guys are going to ball and do a nice job. They are really excited about where they are and where they came from and to be out of that mess. We feel like we're just getting rolling. I'm really fired up for Bobby and K.J. and the guys that have been around playing, to see the turn, because those guys really led the turn and it's great that it happened.”

How much not being worried about the offense is just due to the fact that over time in the second half of the season, offenses in general seem to cool down?

“Offenses, or the defense is improving. What we have witnessed newer own team, we have seen us get so much better on defense and look, we went right through our division near the end and Washington was really loaded up, too. It's been hard. It's just been really challenging. We have worked really hard to not get desperate and not take shots where we don't need to try to force the issue and make sure that we did the things that you need to do to win and that's continuing to find the balance that we need, and also take care of the football. These teams, they are explosive seems and they will take the ball off you in a heartbeat if you give them a chance. Russ did a fantastic job of not letting that happen.”

Maybe encouraging Russ a shot to take more calculated risks because of how much offenses cool down and how much defenses pick it up.

"I don't want to comment too much about that at this point because everybody is going to try to figure out how to beat us now. We've just got to hit them when we get our chances and continue to keep working it. We're always looking. We're always hunting. This is an explosive mentality in this program and when it doesn't happen, we get frustrated, too, because we want it to happen that way. We're just trying to win the games. We tried to finish the season winning four games in a row and get that knocked out and see where that takes us. I'm really excited about going forward. I'm not worried about whatever you guys are worried about and all that. They got to play us and we got to do stuff and they got to stop us in the fourth quarter and he's been pretty dynamic then."

What was it like to see WR DK Metcalf and WR Tyler Lockett get some records today with receptions receiving yards and what does it mean to have both those guys come through like they did?

"That was awesome. I think that they've both had great seasons. They've been unbelievable for us. Tyler getting a 100 catches was really special today and having the 100th one be the touchdown was really cool. He was great all day. DK has had an unbelievable year. He's just continued to build, continued to grow. The whole receiving crew has been special and it starts definitely with those two guys and how they've gone about the business every day."

Can you confirm a social media rumor for us? Why did you call that play for WR David Moore at the end of the game?

"We called that play because David had a \$100,000 on the line if he got that catch. It's a blessing to be able to help his family, his daughter and all that stuff. It's a part of the game. We wanted to get him that catch and we were able to dial that up for him on that last play."

For two weeks in a row now you have kind of struggled out of the gates in the first half this game and for this game it was the first three quarters. What do you make of that and is that a bit at all concerning to you?

"I think the first quarter we were moving the ball well, we just didn't get a chance to score in the end zone down there. They did some good stuff down there at the end. But really the second and third quarter is where we got stagnant a little bit. They did some good stuff and they stopped on third down. They had the ball for a while too and on a couple of those drives we were three and out. I think when you're playing a division team with a great system and scheme, you've got to be able to find ways to convert in the fourth quarter. We had to figure out a way to go win the game. They've been playing really good football the past several weeks as we've, as we've seen. For us we had to step up in the fourth quarter and find a way to win the game. That's the great thing about this game. I've said this several times, but I think to be able to win in all different fashions is really key and has always been the key. Obviously, we want to start great and we know how we can do that as well. But you also have to be able to win the games close because that's what playoff football is like. When all the nerves and the feelings and the tension comes out we can use that to catapult us for the playoffs and use those moments to tap back into that play. The playoffs aren't always high scoring, sometimes they are sometimes they're not. You've just got to go out there and win the game. That's what really matters in the fourth quarter when the game was on the line, we had to go win the game and when we did."

If there's anything in the offense that you'd just like to see be more sharp in the playoffs, what would it be?

"I think we've got to get to those more explosive plays here and there. I think anytime you get those explosive plays, that definitely helps out. I think we've got to get to some of those calls and get to some of those moments if we can. I think all that matters in the playoffs is do you win the game or not? Whatever it is, that's really what we care about in this locker room, just winning the game. We were able to get those explosive plays and some of those explosive runs in the fourth quarter when the game was on the line and we were able to convert and make some big time catches. Tyler made some big time catches and scrambled a few times. Tyler came across the field in the other one and we've hit that first touchdown to Tyler in that tight window before, and did a good job of scrambling, got away from the guy and stayed alive. Those things are going to happen and I think that would be continually great to see throughout the playoffs."

How much more complete does this team now feel with the defense playing the way it is and special teams where it's been all year? Can you compare how you feel about this team now, to say October when you guys were beating teams 38-31 and things like that?

"I think this season just of life has been a journey. It's been crazy in so many different ways and we cannot take for granted having 12 wins and finding ways to win. I go back to the first five, six games or whatever it was, and how we had to win those games at the end of the game. Those high scoring and with the back and forth, just doing all the things that we needed to do, throwing the ball deep, mixing it up, just being explosive in our passing and all the things we had to do. And when we had to win the games in the last second in the game, thinking about the Minnesota game, thinking about how our defense stopped them against the Patriots down the end and all those moments. Our defense has just continued to grow and continue to build and they've been one of the best defenses in the national football league. So that's the exciting part. Then the offense as well, we know what we're capable of and we know what we can do, especially when everybody's healthy and everything else. They played a really good game today. They did a really good job and they played hard. Unfortunately we weren't able to convert some of those third downs. We were a yard short here, or a half six inches short there, whatever it may be on a couple of those third down conversions early on. But it's a process. I think I've told you all this earlier in the year, but the reality is every game has its own history. And you have to find ways to win when the game is on the line. Can you make the shot? Can you make the throw? Can you make the catch? Can you make the play? Can you make the run? Can you make the tackle? And today we were able to do that again."

Following up on the pass game, it looked like the downfield accuracy was off a little bit in the first three quarters. Was that scheme or something else?

"I wouldn't say it was off. I had to throw a couple balls away because they were right there. Unfortunately we weren't able to make those. I don't think we have to worry about the deep ball accuracy. I think we know how to do that pretty well. I think the biggest thing is sometimes you've got to throw it away and just live for another day. I think that was most of them on those plays."

Can you just take us through the last touchdown to Tyler on fourth down, what you guys are trying to do and how you ended up going to Tyler there?

"Everybody was kind of just crossing and try to make it really difficult. [RB] Chris Carson did a great job stepping up and blocking [49ers LB] Fred [Warner]. He's been a great blitzier all year. Chris Carson stoned him in the backfield and that was key. I just kept retreating and then Tyler scooted across the field and made another great catch. I just tried to put it in a spot where only he could get it and get his feet in and everything else, and he was able to do it. That was a great play call and a great play by Tyler."

You mentioned how big explosive plays would be for you guys getting some more moving forward. How do you balance that with opponents who are seemingly wanting to try to take that away from you the last half of the season or so? And when do you bide your time and take those shots, knowing they're trying to take that away from you and that balancing act?

"I think the biggest balancing act is more so taking our shots, but also running it and mixing it in and doing all that stuff. We've got great players across the field. So we want to be to get the ball to Chris Carson and be able to let him run it too and be physical. And with our backs and what they can do. And then you also want to be able to get the ball to our receivers with all the things they can do. They, they had some good past rushes. They did some good stuff today. They mixed up some good things. I think our line kept battling. And in the fourth quarter they did a great job of slowing those guys down up front and we were able to capitalize when we needed to. I think the biggest thing is just staying focused on the process this week. We've got a great process coming up we've got a great challenge ahead of us. The great thing is we get to go back home and the team that we've got to play in the Rams is going to be a really good football team and they're going to be ready to play again and we know that, so we've got to get ready to roll."

You moved ahead of former Miami Dolphins QB Dan Marino for most touchdowns in your first nine years, only former Denver Broncos QB Peyton Manning had more and getting into 40 touchdowns. What are those marks mean to you to be of up there with some of those guys?

"I think the most important stat is winning and all the wins we've been able to do. To get to 12 wins again, and hopefully go into this playoffs and see if we can win four games again, one at a time, I think that's the most insignificant thing. It's been a blessing obviously to have receivers that break records like Tyler and DK and those guys. But I think as a quarterback the most important stat is in the win column and can you score touchdowns? Can you find ways of getting the ball into the end zone? And I think over the past nine years, I've definitely be fortunate to be able to do that. To be mentioned in the same categories, obviously with Peyton. Peyton's a guy I've always looked up to and someone I've been close to in the past several years. And Dan Marino is one of the greatest quarterbacks of all time. I think it's definitely a blessing. I think those stats matter, touchdowns do matter. It's definitely one of those things that is significant and we've been able to get a lot of them. So you can't take those touchdowns for granted."

When did you become aware that David had the incentive on the line and how did that conversation go as you guys went with that plan?

"I knew earlier in the week a little bit to be honest with you. I kept it low key. I just kind of knew in the back of my head. Then as the game was going on, Tyler was making all the catches and DK was making a few here and there. I tried to give one to him earlier, but they had covered it. Then it was the last drive and we got the ball back and we were in the huddle. I said 'hold on, let's get this call here.' We were able to do that. [Quarterback coach] Austin [Davis] and I were talking about on the sideline too. So we were able to get that in and he got that catch, so it's pretty cool. It's a blessing and he's worked so hard this year, he definitely earned it."

Excuse me, just to be clear you changed the call in the huddle?

"Yeah, we talked about it. We were going to kneel it and then we ended up changing it. Austin and I we were talking and we had talked on the sideline earlier about trying to find a way to get it done. Austin actually said let's just get it done here. So then we ended up calling it and I said, 'Dave, you're going to get the ball right here' and I kind of winked at him. So that was pretty cool."
